The device captures every movement of a golfer's putting stroke in real-time, analyzing eight key parameters of the stroke. The device lets the golfer know what they are doing right, what they are doing wrong, and even how to fix the problem.

“We are excited to begin working with the TOMI and also with our new state-of-the-art video equipment” said Adam Foegen, Director of Golf at Tennessee National. “With the TOMI we will be able to pick up on any inconsistency within the putting stroke that the naked eye may not pick up on. This new system and video equipment will greatly enhance our teaching capabilities and the golfing experience of our members.”
